Study Purpose & Research Methods

Study Purpose

Determine the impact of Hurricane Ian on consumers' feelings about travel to the Paradise Coast. This is the 1st wave of multiple waves of the survey to see how consumer sentiment changes over time.

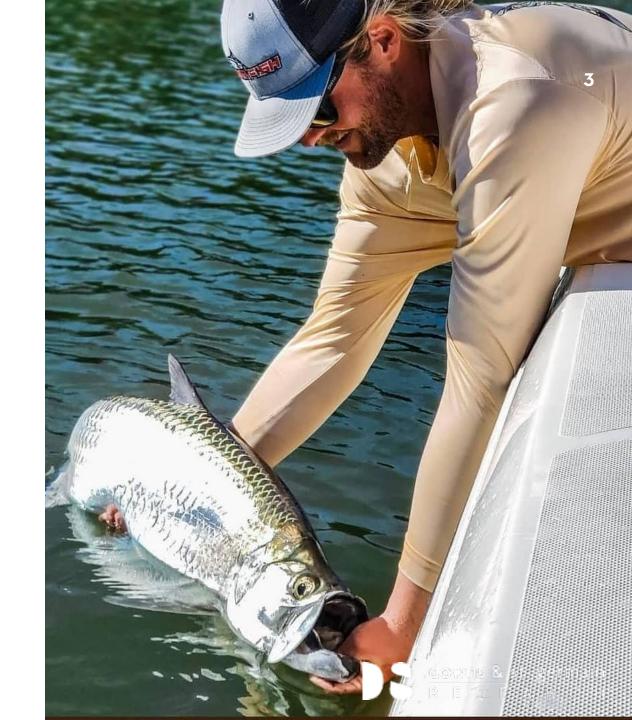
Research Methods

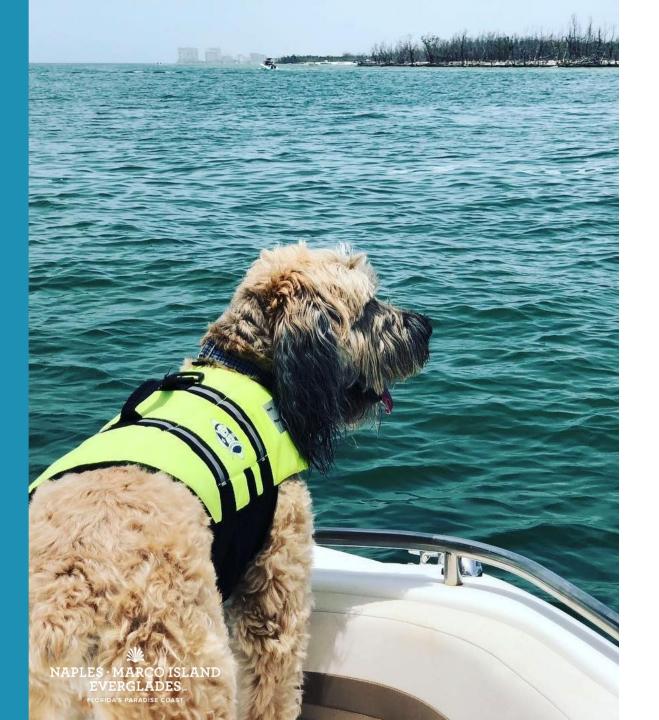
Online surveys with 521 consumers in Chicago, New York City, Detroit, Cleveland, Boston, Minneapolis-St. Paul, Philadelphia, Hartford, Miami/Ft. Lauderdale, the Tampa area, and Orlando.

• Wave 1 - February 9-20, 2023

Consumers were adults age 21+ who earned at least \$75,000 per year in household income, served as key decision-makers in where their households take vacations, and have taken at least one vacation to a beach destination in Florida in the past 10 years.

Key Takeaways:

- Top of mind awareness of the aftermath of Hurricane Ian is low
 - 1% of potential visitors mentioned they wouldn't plan on trip to the Paradise Coast due to the hurricane
- 1% of potential visitors reported cancelling a trip to the Paradise Coast
 - The median rescheduled trip will be taken in late September 2023
- Nearly 4 in 5 potential visitors believe the Paradise Coast is ready welcome back visitors or received a limited impact from the storm





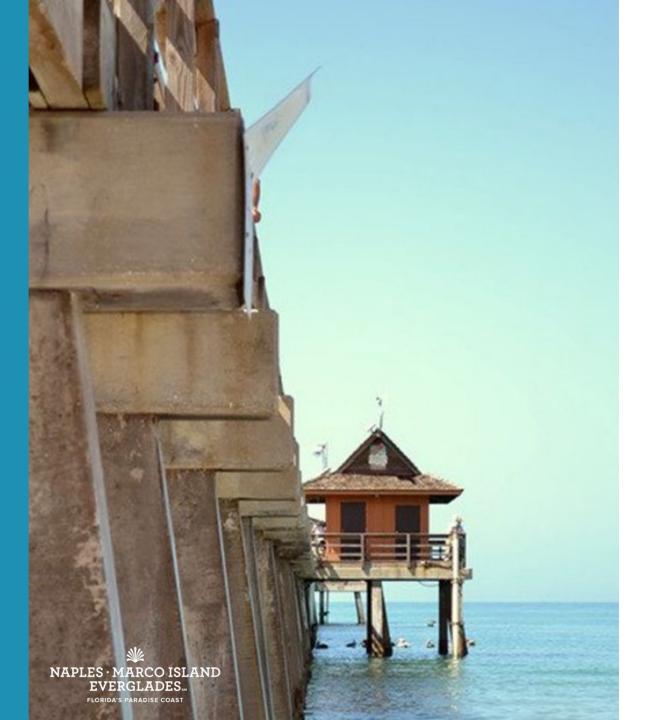
- Potential visitors are most confident the restaurants and shopping are ready for visitors
- 1 in 6 potential visitors believe the beaches in the Paradise Coast are not ready to welcome back visitors.
 - This is an educational opportunity to highlight working beaches
- When give a chance to give a word or phrase about the current state of the Paradise Coast, 2 in 5 potential visitors mentioned hurricane damage or a state of rebuilding
- Friends & family are the top trusted source regarding the status of Southwest Florida as a travel destination
- Despite the hurricane, beautiful beaches and water are the top draw to visiting the area followed by weather

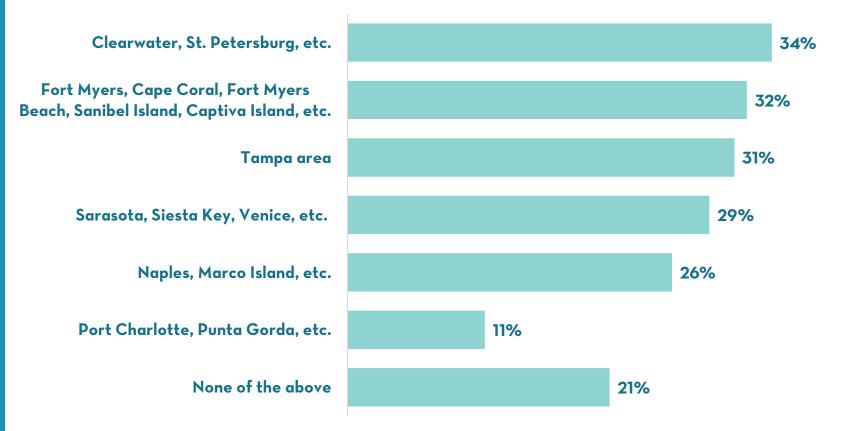

Visiting Florida in the coming year*





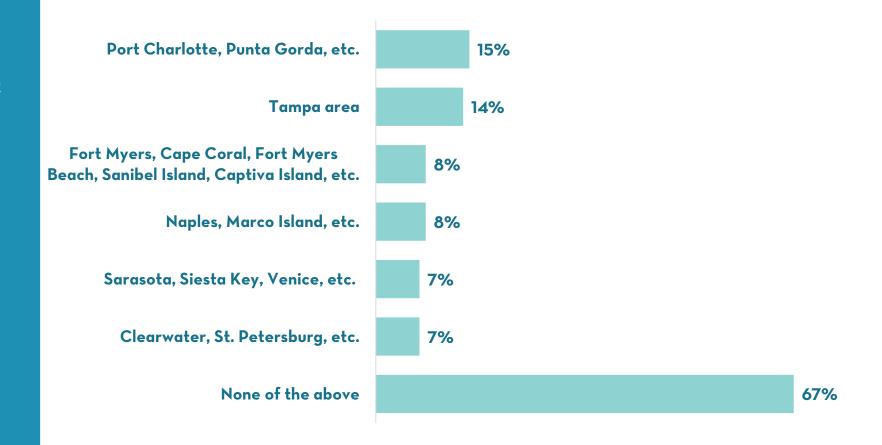


Areas not considered for Florida Vacation

Only 1 in 12 consumers stated that they would not consider the Paradise Coast during the planning phase of their trip

Only 1% would of all potential visitors would not consider the Paradise Coast due to hurricane related reasons

Areas not considered for Florida Vacation*





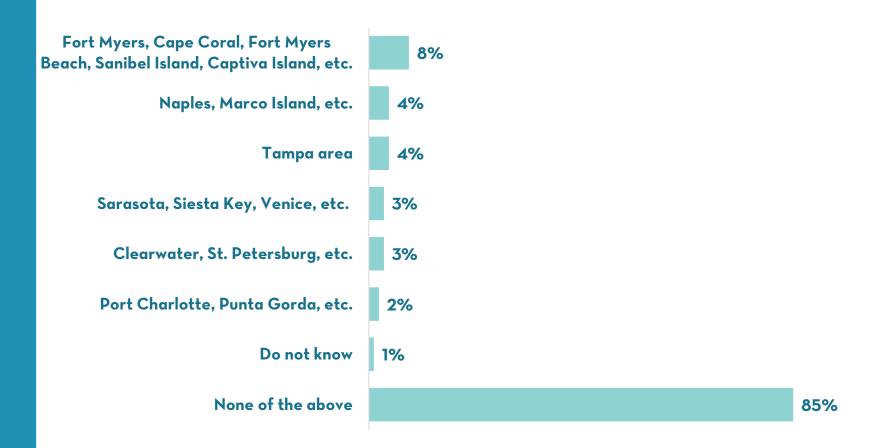


Trip Cancellations

Only 1 in 25 consumers stated that they had to cancel a trip to Paradise Coast during the past 6 months

1 in 5 who cancelled their trip to the Paradise Coast did so for hurricane-related reasons

Trip Cancellations*





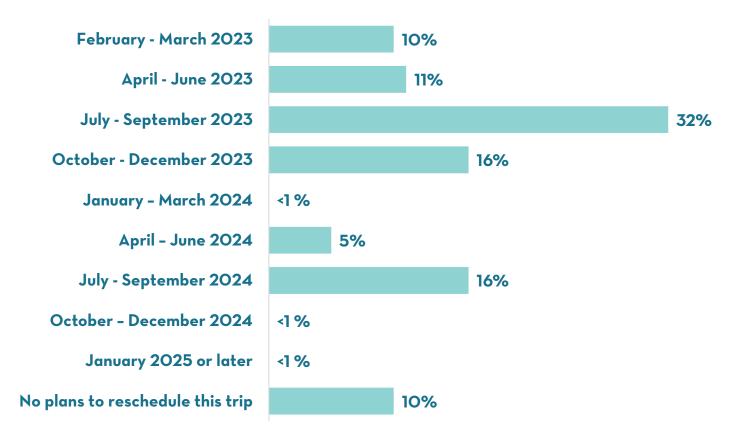


Trip Rescheduling To Return to Naples/Marco Island Area

Trip Rescheduling To Return to Naples/Marco Island Area*



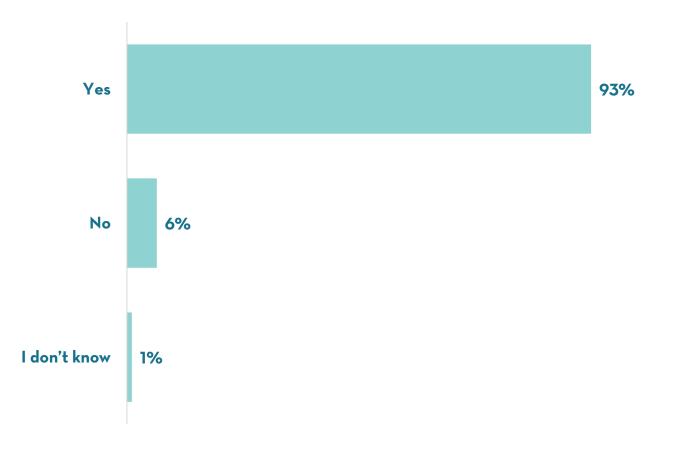




Hurricane Landfall Recall

Hurricane Landfall Recall*





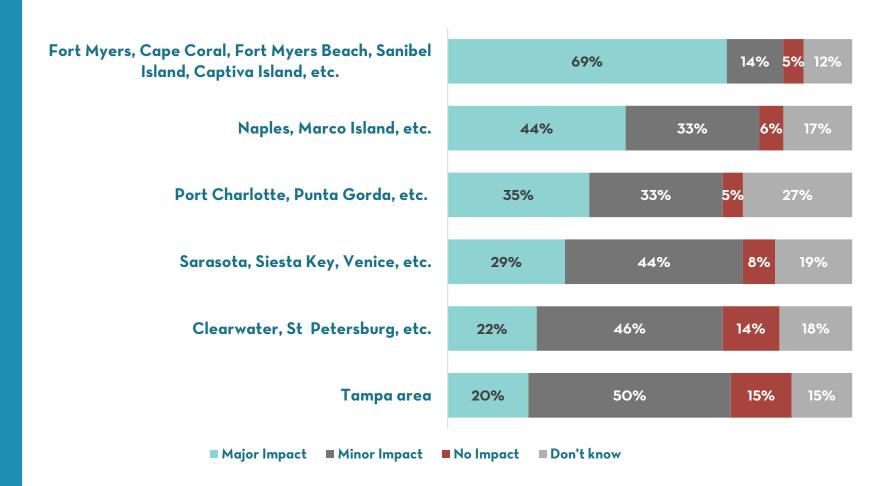


Perceived impact of Hurricane Ian in Florida areas

Perceived impact of Hurricane Ian in Florida areas*



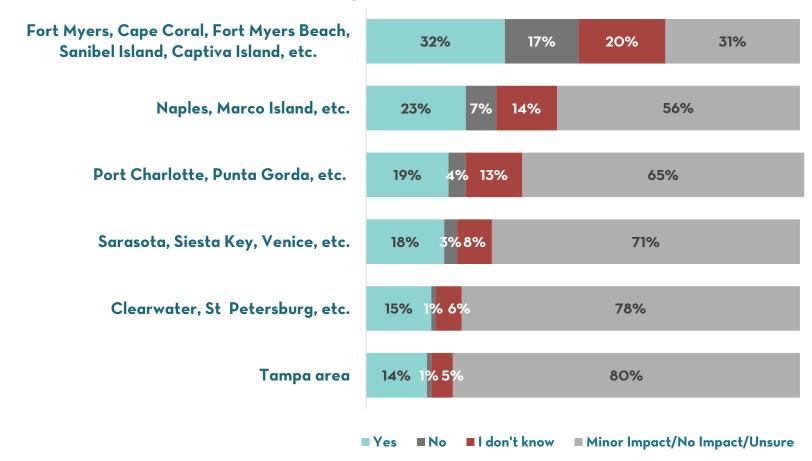




Perceived readiness of each area to welcome visitors

Nearly 4 in 5 consumers find the Paradise Coast ready to welcome visitors after Hurricane Ian or the area received limited impact

Perceived readiness of each area to welcome visitors*







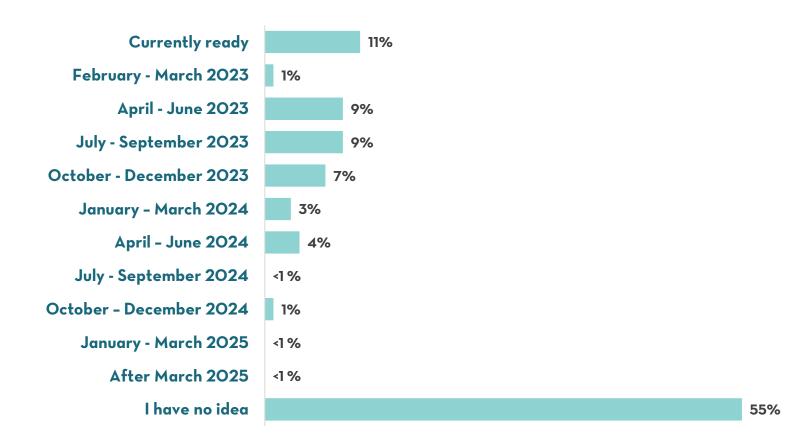
Perceived readiness timeline

Nearly 3 in 5 consumers who do not believe the Paradise Coast are not ready for visitors don't know when the area will be ready to welcome visitors after Hurricane Ian

Perceived readiness timeline*



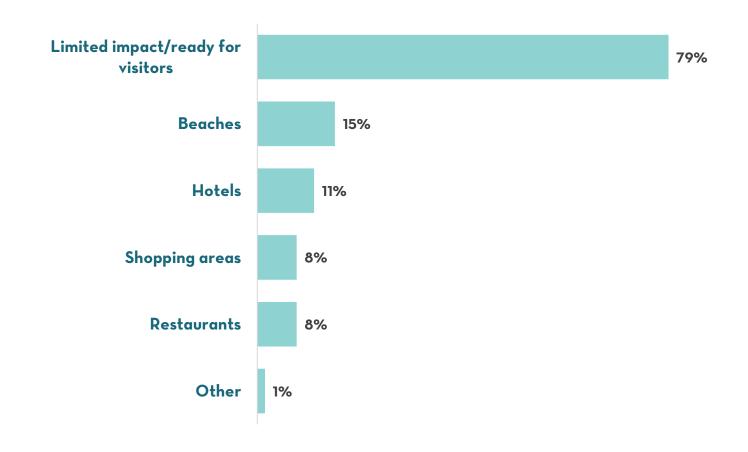




Perceived readiness for attractions

Nearly 4 in 5 consumers who do not believe the Paradise Coast is ready to welcome visitors (15% of all consumers) do not think beaches are ready to welcome visitors after Hurricane Ian

Areas of the Paradise Coast NOT Ready for Visitors*



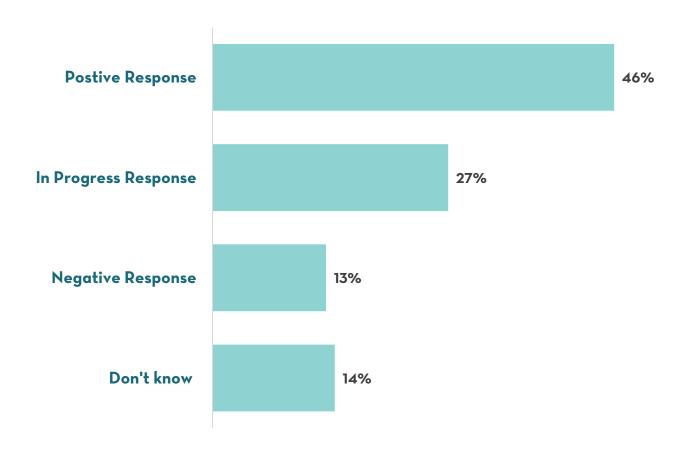




Views on the current state of Naples

Views on the current state of Naples*



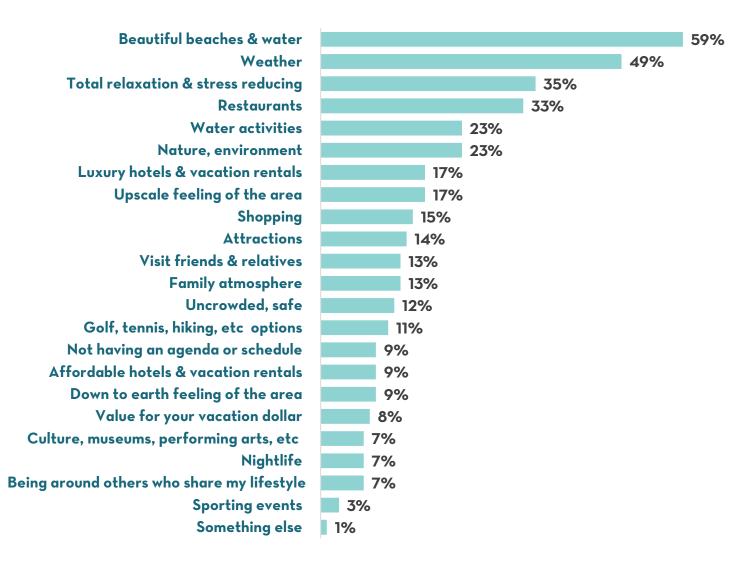




Best Reasons to visit

Best Reasons to visit*

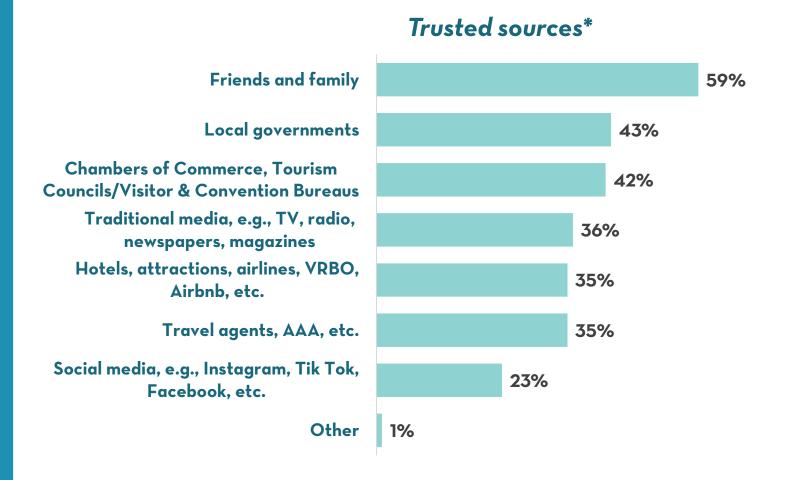






Trusted sources

Friends and family are the most trusted source of information regarding hurricane recovery.











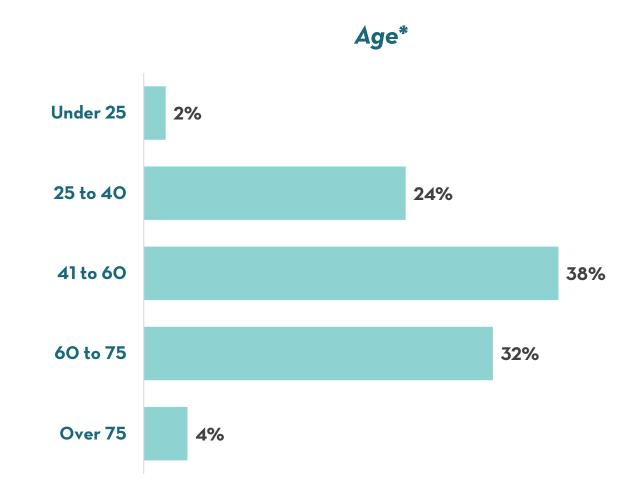

The median income was \$126,500



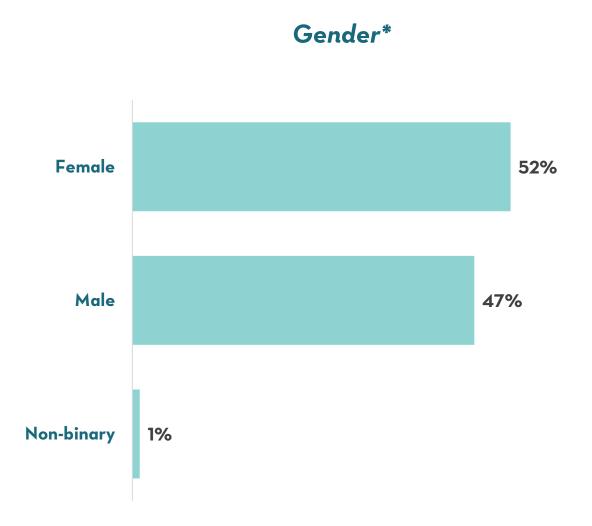






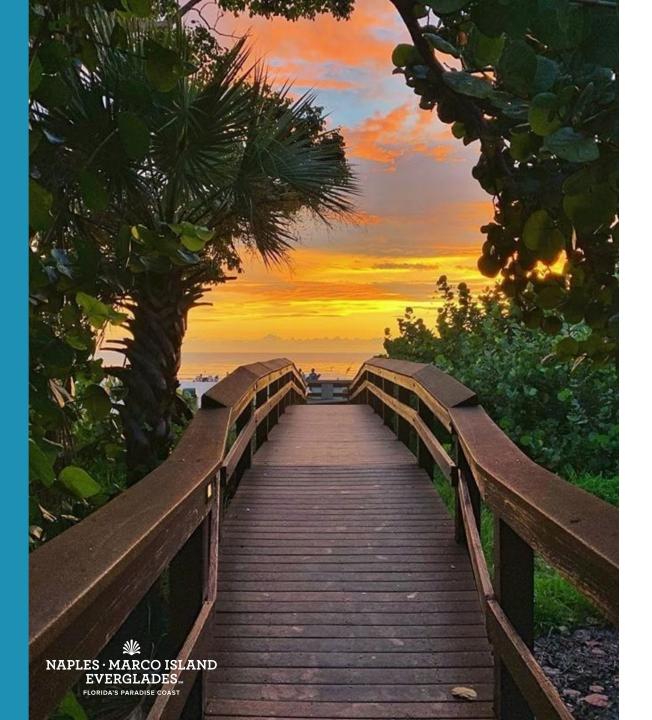
Gender
